One year ago, at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, there was a surge of anti-Asian violence. Just this week, Stop AAPI Hate released a report documenting 3,795 anti-Asian racist incidents, 68% directed towards Asian women. And, on Tuesday, in Atlanta, yet another vicious act of violent hatred, xenophobia and misogyny resulted in mass deaths in the Asian community.

None of us can pretend to be surprised. Powerful political forces have manufactured division across our country, seeking to generate fear, trying to prevent us from standing up for one another and seeing our shared humanity. This is the same machinery that has resulted in increased antisemitism, and acts of violence against our Black and Brown neighbors, immigrants, and so many others. This, combined with much too easy access to guns in our country, resulted in yet another tragedy
